Empowering Communities with Lifesaving Tools to Prevent Overdoses

The Wayne County Department of Health, Human, and Veterans Services (HHVS) is working in partnership with the Center for Behavioral Health and Justice (CBHJ) on the **"Well Wayne Stations"** initiative—aiming to reduce overdose deaths in Wayne County by expanding community access to the lifesaving overdose reversal medication naloxone (Narcan®) and harm reduction supplies, including fentanyl/xylazine drug testing strips. These supplies are accessible at Well Wayne Station vending machines and newsstand devices throughout Wayne County, at no cost to the community.

HHVS and CBHJ are working alongside a diverse, multi-sector array of community partners, serving as host sites and bringing overdose prevention access to the community.



Aims

- **Reduce overdose deaths**
- **Increase community access** to free, lifesaving tools and public health supplies
- **Establish naloxone (Narcan®) access points** in all 43 municipalities of Wayne County
- **Prioritize access in communities most impacted**
- **Address and reduce the stigma** associated with overdose, substance misuse, and substance use disorders (SUD)
- **Increase community awareness, education, and use of overdose prevention strategies**
